THE SAGA OF HÖDR & LOKI

"Hödr stood outside the ring of men, because he was blind. Then spake Loki to him: 'Why dost thou not shoot at Baldr?' He answered: 'Because I see not where Baldr is; and for this also, that I am weaponless."

Hodr is reported to be strong enough in other locations in the lore, but he is not included in

the games which the other gods have determined show Baldur honor. Hodr is in reality that example of every man or woman who is standing at the edge of the crowd. They could be standing their for any number of reasons. The list is a long one and all the reasons on that list cultivate a victim mentality, whether the reason they are outcast is their own fault or not. The rise of Christianity counted on these outcast, downtrodden, poor hapless souls with all kinds of vague promises. The various social and political movements amongst men have all used the same tactic. Give that person on the edge of the crowd someone to blame and they will hurl just about anything into the center of the crowd. They will kill their own neighbors, brothers, countrymen with full justification.

But nothing changes. All that has taken place is the ability of one individual to unleash his particular brand of mental illness onto the world via the hapless soul who could not see the game, nor the rules of life. They may have often wondered why they could not get ahead. They may have fumed greatly as various politicians rammed ideas down the collective throat of the opposing parties. When these types of individuals begin to pay attention to the deceit being whispered into their ears, the only thing which changes is the idea that they won't have to feel so alone anymore. It doesn't matter what it costs anyone else. When you begin to approach this idea in todays world, full of isolated individuals in their homes, with ready access to the internet and all its nonsense, it is not someone else whispering into their ear. It is their ego.

Then said Loki: 'Do thou also after the manner of other men, and show Baldr honor as the other men do. I will direct thee where he stands; shoot at him with this wand.'

These isolated individuals find a ready-made list of people and concepts to hate on the internet. They will see ten or ten thousand feeling the same way. I would like to point out that even hundred thousand does not amount to a hill of beans in a world of 7 billion. But these poor hapless people think it does. So now they may begin in earnest. Spewing whatever vile nonsense they think is right in their eyes. They've never once made the decision to address any of the issues which ensured that they stood around by themselves. Nope. Just like a river winds its way across the surface of the earth, finding the path of least resistance, so we get crooked rivers and crooked men. Now, with all the input from the internet they have a guide where they might unleash their discontent in the most effective way.

"Hödr took Mistletoe and shot at Baldr, being guided by Loki: the shaft flew through Baldr, and he fell dead to the earth; and that was the greatest mischance that has ever befallen among gods and men."

Hodr was simply a tool for Loki. In the exact same way that Regin convinced the fatherless Sigurth that Fafnir, a being who had absolutely nothing to do with him, was also his enemy. The fact that this pattern is repeated in the lore should be recognized for what it is. A warning. If you find yourself alone in the world be aware that there are many who will use the purposeless person for their own ends. They will seemingly offer a purpose of some kind which more than likely has nothing to do with the gifts that have been handed down for generations. Each generation blended with another family line of gifts making sure that yours is unique. But I digress. The pattern we should recognize is that the ego of one has had an effect on all. Someone else bought into the shiny words of someone everyone knows is always causing a problem. This is the kind of thing which happens all the time. Just stop for a second and take a look at those who have garnered the most power for themselves in the shortest amount of time. They will have given the poor someone to blame for being poor. They will have given the national interest someone to blame for the shabby state of affairs in their nation. On and on it goes. For every possible state of being, there is someone to blame for what amounts to your inability to deal with the problems you have in your life. Hodr was blind. Would you set a blind man down in an area where all manner of weapons was likely to ricochet in any direction? No. But it kind of hurts to be left out no matter the reason. In an age where we have far too many people we might blame for our predicaments and an ego ready made to feed off these situations where we might be slighted, which do you think it is easier to do, figure that reason out and be comfortable in your own skin, or feed that ego with anger and righteous indignation because someone forgot how important you were in your own mind? Make no mistake, people will take the lives of other people to prove how right they think they are. 100's of millions of them perished in the 20th century alone over this very thing. Someone, or group, was named as the source of the problem and no one batted an eye when it came time to take their lives. It mattered not if they were the sun in the eyes of their family.

Do you know what else the story of Loki and Hodr, Regin and Sigurth represents? It represents the damage a negative thought will do to your thinking process. Before you even get started on a project all of the conditioned thought pattern's we have been taught by those closest to us will remind us that, whatever it is you are dreaming of, it will fail. Before we have even started, we have learned to talk ourselves out of success. When these thoughts originate from someone outside of that circle we should be doubly cautious of what they want. I assure you that those who speak most loudly about being a victim, or who are reminding us of who we ought to properly hate and despise, are not interested in our success. They are interested in you providing that constant feedback of how right they are. The moment you decide to change, grow, or simply walk away from such nonsense, you will see what kind of person they really are

see what killy of person they really are.

"Then, when Baldr was fallen, words failed all the, Æsir, and their hands likewise to lay hold of him; each looked at the other, and all were of one mind as to him who had. wrought the work, but none might take vengeance, so great a sanctuary was in that place."

I wonder if we will ever be able to create a location which we all consider to such a holy place. A place where even the Gods might allow themselves to be vulnerable enough to display emotion at such a great loss. Where violence, the leftover and very necessary remnant of our savage past, might never take a toehold in our consciousness spurring us on to irrational action. Are we focusing our mind and heart into such a state of being that we will willingly deny the violent expression of our ego? Justifiable or not. Our ancestors had such places. They had Groves in the forest which men held in the highest of esteem and reverence. Perhaps even some wooden structures. Not to mention the great monolithic stone works with their amazingly accurate celestial alignments. Perhaps it is time for us to consider setting our egos to the side and building just such a place. No one is stopping us. Nothing but our own unwillingness to celebrate the divine instead of using them as a crutch to justify our radical departure from the norms of society.

"But when the Æsir tried to speak, then it befell first that weeping broke out, so that none might speak to the others with words concerning his grief. But Odin bore that misfortune by so much the worst, as he had most perception of how great harm and loss for the Æsir were in the death of Baldr."

And it is a sad thing. When the God who has shown us so many times how and what to sacrifice realizes that only so many will ever understand, or have the courage to make that sacrifice, it must be a sad thing to see indeed. It is no wonder that the goddess Hel is so feared. She is feared for the same reason her realm is so important. We all understand that each ancestor bears a torch for us. That aspect of Kenaz which represents the wisdom of all our ancestors. But it also represents all of those unfilled dreams and potential they each possess yet never took the opportunity to cultivate. To watch our son's fall by the way in life without ever taking the action necessary to develop the potential of who they are is the fear of each and every father. All those gifts squandered in life to be sequestered away in that great repository of knowledge we know as the halls of our ancestors. Who wants to be standing in front of that sun facing goddess knowing that we never lived up to our potential? We will always fail to live up to that potential while we are waiting on the approval of others. We must live our life for ourselves to ensure a future for our sons and daughters. Not for some cause we are told is important. Not for some political idea some of our friends believe gives them purpose. For ourselves and our dreams. Never forget that

governments were created by men to avoid dealing with the divine in as much as men sought to take the power of the gods without making the sacrifice our gods have lived through. These stories of our gods are the stories we ought to be listening too. Not the words

of egotistical men who have lost at life.


