YULE AT ODINSHOF ~ 2019

This fifth year of Yuletide at Odinshof had families from far and wide joining us, many for the first time with a strong sense of good cheer and conviviality. The enormous Yule tree was hoisted through the door right after lunch. It measured almost as wide as it was high, with deep green foliage and branches spaced perfectly for lights and handmade ornaments.

Over the next few hours, families with wide-eyed children would continue coming through the door, with warm greetings, handshakes and hugs. The kitchen area was set-aside for messy projects like graham-cracker cottages smeared with frosting and well-placed candies by the stickiest hands, ever!

At a mid-afternoon ceremony, wee baby, Zoey was formally named before the Folk. Gothi Matt Flavel, spoke of the Norns who weave the patterns of life. Then he marked her brow with mead, of three runes that would guide her on life's journey.

Back indoors, presents for the children had been in various stages of wrapping all afternoon. It was finally time for Papa Yule to stride into the room, his staff held high, and take a seat by the tree. It seemed like an endless supply of both children and gifts but Papa Yule made sure that all received presents that were "just right."

Dinner featured ham, turkey, braised brisket, various potatoe dishes, green beans, breads, mulled wine and desserts. Throughout it all, voices were boistrous and bright.

The day had transformed to darkness when we all returned to the our sacred circle for the main ritual of the day. To a heavy drumbeat, Alsherjargothi Flavel, led us slowly into the space. Placing our hands of the full horn of mead, we had the opportunity to give our own gifts to our Gods of this season. Gifts offered and then gifts received from the Holy Powers. Matt carried the horn with its precious blessings to each person in the circle. Horn high, words were spoken to many deities, followed by a sip of mead.

And then, in a hushed tone, Matt announced that a ceremony of Ordination for Sheila McNallen was about to commence. Matt called Gothi Thorgrun Odden and Steve McNallen to come forward, along with Sheila. Each of the four held a tall, red candle as Sheila recited the Gothar Oath. Toasts were made, and powerful, loving words were spoken in support of Sheila's completion of the Gothar Program. At the conclusion, Sheila "Hailed the AFA" with the pouring of mead into the bonfire. A brilliant, golden ball of energy lit up the darkness.

Back inside Odinshof, the auction commenced with swiftness and exhuberance, and the winner of the 50/50 raffle was announced. The Secret Santa gift exchange was the last activity of the evening. Clever and creative gifts were bartered among a dozen or so people. The gathering was coming to a close. For many, it was time to get back on the road. Farewells and thankyous were said, with everyone agreeing that the day had felt like a family reunion, full of bliss and a sense of tradition. Gods' bless us, everyone!

Day of Remembrance for Raud the Strong



Europe / Sweden






Hroptatyr kindred welcomed Sunna back to Midgard on the 21st of December.

As the people gathered in our sacred circle Wotan's name was called,

the Wild Hunt was hailed and the Jolfather was honoured and given a tasty drink from the horn. After the ritual was finished people gathered back in the main hall to enjoy each others company and share a horn or three.

Saturday dawned beautifully and our day began with a hearty egg casserole for breakfast to get us prepared for the coming day. After breakfast the children, and some adults as well, gathered to craft their own personal Tomte dolls. This activity was a great success by all accounts, we were even blessed with a Tomte to watch over the main hall for our weekend. Many



thanks to Brandy Callahan and Angela Winchell for leading that.

Afterwards we gathered around our fire again to celebrate Yule with a proper blot led by Les Lauer. He always does a great job and it has become something of a tradition for him to lead this ritual over the last few



years. Following his inspiring ritual the women were led in a ritual led by Gythia Anna Funk. A ritual designed to strengthen the bonds between the women of the region and honour the Goddesses(if I understood right) at this holy tide.



Afterwards we all gathered together to enjoy a feast of epic proportions, a traditional ham with all the sides, chili, kraut and knoephla, Angie's delicious rice soup, homemade kuchen, pecan pie, and the list goes on. It was a feast for the ages. The afternoon saw us enjoy a few hours playing a Norse trivia game created by our own local member Mark Cook. Even some of the children were able to answer on occasion, was nice to see everyone come together and enjoy a very traditional style game of knowledge sharing.

The evening brought our auction led by member Whitney Schlafman, as always. She does a great job of showcasing the amazing things people bring to our

auction table. Massive portraits of Woden, hand carved rune talismans, homemade mead, and on and on. These auctions allow us to be able to host our events free of charge so we are always very appreciative of the participation and bidding by our local folk.

Later we gathered together for a sumbel that is maybe a bit different than others. We do our traditional 3 rounds of course, but we do it indoors, in a rustic cabin seated nearly on top of one another. It is very comfortable and very close knit and another tradition we have created up here that people enjoy very much. As always we were blessed with many great songs by our skald Mark Cook who performs some very rousing traditional style songs.....this year even saw our very own Casey Liebold step up and sing an emotional, heart felt song that had the whole room enthralled.



Sunday we again gathered around the fire as member Brandy Callahan led us in a Wayfarer blot to see us all home safely. She did a great job and I look forward to standing around a fire as she leads blot again in the future. Afterwards it was time to pack up and say our goodbyes. If you have never been up to one of our bigger celebrations you have no idea what you are missing.

We rediscovered your holy grail, lifting our heads high to behold the grandeur of the spinning sun!


Life! Purpose! Victory!

Virginia members of the Irongard Kindred met and celebrated a beautiful Yule, with a traditional Icelandic lamb meal prepared by


our Sven Heruli. We look forward to a busy and happy new year, especially our upcoming national event, Ostara in the South!

GERMANIC/ NORSE LAW

IOOOce.

For a thousand years our ancient code of law lay in manuscripts written on velum in Latin and later translated into Old Norwegian, of course, the laws were first in oral form spoken

by a Law Speaker at times of Assembly, ie., a parliamentary form of government. Old Norwegian was still spoken in the remote parts of Norway,(as did my emigrant family), and in 1935, a professor of history at the University of Illinois, Laurence M. Larson translated the two regional laws of Norway, the Gulating and the Frostating into modern English. The name of the book is, "The Earliest Norwegian Laws, Columbia University Press.

I am writing this in order to dispel the propaganda by the winner of this culture war that our people were lawless, backward and ignorant. The Germanic/Norse law code was as advanced toward human rights and in the case of women, superior, as this book shows. Our ancient culture as stated was an oral culture where trust of one's word and being a "high trust" culture, worked until writing was required in dealing with an highly organized urban culture. My belief is that in a low trust culture every agreement must be written, as in a highly collectivized culture people are seen as a commodity not as an individual.

When around 343ce., the Roman Empire merged with the State and later became the Holy Roman Empire 800c., and the Dark Age began in earnest and Feudalism was the only choice for 99% of the European people. In 1555ce., the Christian Church encountered a revolt led by a cleric and the printing press, that spat out small books that people could read and it was the change agent. It is interesting that the area where this happened is just where the old Germanic/Norse laws were in effect centuries earlier, coincidence, I think not.

Again, we are at another time of change and today it is the Internet and now the same tyranny that burned Luther's small books wants to do quell this new revolt against liberty and again, this change agent the Net, comes from the same people that lived in our Homeland, Europe a thousand years ago.

Here are chapters from this scarce book;

- 1. The Church Law, (added by St.Olaf) and should be at the last as it really was the newest.
- 2. The Merchant Law

TAKING CONTROL OF OUR LIVES

We will all go through many trials in life. Tough times may seem like they will never end in the midst of them. Our thoughts govern so much more of our ability to navigate even the darkest of depressions or the tightest moments of anxiety. Yet we have made it through them time and again. We have all approached this faith with the idea and hope of something better. Our gods and ancestors have shown us by their actions that we do indeed have what it takes to take control of our lives. There is so much potential with that idea in action in our lives we might hardly comprehend it. So what does it look like when we quit finding other things to become upset about in our new faith? Well, we have an image of that as well.

LIII. Then spake Gangleri: "Shall any of the gods live then, or shall there be then any earth or heaven?"

Because that is the real question of the day. What will I look like if I let go of all the things I am supposed to be outraged about? What if I let go of all the pain I think makes me important or worthy of attention in someone else's eyes? What will I feel if I am no longer anxious about every waking moment and what people think? Will I still be important? Is there some kind of divine in my life if I let go of the self-imposed sense of struggle so common in social issues?

Hárr answered: "In that time the earth shall emerge out of the sea and shall then be green and fair; then shall the fruits of it be brought forth unsown. Vídarr and Váli shall be living, inasmuch as neither sea nor the fire of Surtr shall have harmed them; and they shall dwell at Ida-Plain, where Ásgard was before. And then the sons of Thor, Módi and Magni, shall come there, and they shall have Mjöllnir there. After that Baldr shall come thither, and Hödr, from Hel; then all shall sit down together and hold speech. with one another, and call to mind their secret wisdom, and speak of those happenings which have been before: of the Midgard Serpent and of Fenris-Wolf. Then they shall find in the grass those golden chesspieces which the Æsir had had; thus is it said:

In the deities' shrines | shall dwell Vídarr and Váli, When the Fire of Surtr is slackened; Módi and Magni | shall have Mjöllnir At the ceasing of Thor's strife.

In the place called Hoddmímir's Holt there shall lie hidden during the Fire of Surtr two of mankind, who are called thus: Líf and Lífthrasir, and for food they shall have the morningdews. From these folk shall come so numerous an offspring that all the world shall be peopled, even as is said here:

Líf and Lífthrasir, | these shall lurk hidden In the Holt of Hoddmímir; The morning dews | their meat shall be; Thence are gendered the generations.

And it may seem wonderful to thee, that the sun shall have borne a daughter not less fair than herself; and the daughter shall then tread in the steps of her mother, as is said here:

The Elfin-beam | shall bear a daughter, Ere Fenris drags her forth; That maid shall go, | when the great gods die, To ride her mother's road.

But now, if thou art able to ask yet further, then indeed I know not whence answer shall come to thee, for I never heard any man tell forth at greater length the course of the world; and now avail thyself of that which thou hast heard."

Once we begin to let go of certain self-sabotaging ideas, given to us by others, our

perception of the Gods themselves change. The sons of Gods and Goddesses lead the way into a new, far green horizon. Where we might reminisce about our pasts and chuckle about the mistakes of our life as we have seen our grandparents do. Laughing at their failures and smiling towards the sunset. Sunsets they know they will see fewer and fewer of as their life nears an end. Our children will lead the way into this bright future. But right now, the battle is ours. To relinquish patterns and old behaviors we have given a fresh coat of paint. Our children will be the ones who recognize the best of the changes within us. They will see it as the sun shining brightly on the promise of their future.






